How does this year deliver your curriculum intent?

Y11 has a clear focus on completing the NEA 1 and NEA 2 coursework as well as preparation for the external examination in June. The NEA 1 is worth 15% of the overall grade and involves students to undertake a practical scientific experiment, based on the brief released by AQA on 1st September. The NEA 2 is worth 35% of the overall grade and is a project based on a brief that is released by AQA 1st November. This project requires students to research and plan to prepare three dishes of their choice in a three hour examination, held in March. The project allows students to trial key skills, helping them to decide which dishes they will cook to fit the brief issued by the exam board. Both NEA's are word processed and include evaluations of the work which takes place. As well as working on NEA's, students will continually go over the theoretical material delivered in y10 to prepare them for the written examination.
