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Dear Parent/Carer

Higher Education Outreach

Students have been awarded for their contributions towards completing their pledges and have been able to focus on one of the key characteristics of their house identity. Standards

We would like to remind all parent/carers of the uniform expectations within the academy. We have seen a rise in students wearing jewellery during the day. After Easter, if a student is found with a piece of jewellery on, this will be placed into an envelope for you to come and collect at main reception. Students will not be able to remove this and keep it on them.

We would also like to remind parent/carers that student must wear full black socks to the academy and that the wearing of ankle socks is not permitted.

Rewards

Students who have gained at least 360 net positive behaviour points and have at least 92% attendance over the course of the school year so far will shortly be invited to select a first, second and third preference for the upcoming Golden Ticket reward events which will be held in the first week back after the Easter break.

The first is "Bowling and a Burger", which is a ticket to play bowling and have a burger at Tenpin in Doncaster during the week commencing Monday 15 April. The second is the Easter Cinema event, which will be a film screening held in school during P3 on Tuesday 16 April. Students will be provided with popcorn and a drink. The third event is "Ready Steady Cook", in which 30 lucky students will take part in a cooking masterclass in school on Tuesday 16 April during P3.

Parents of children who have attained a Golden Ticket have received a ClassCharts message in which students can rank their choices of Golden Ticket events from 1st to 3rd choice, and we will do our best to accommodate as many first choices as possible.

We will communicate which students are taking part in each event before the Easter break.



SLT Detentions

A clear and consistently enforced sanction system is crucial to the functioning of exceptional schools. With this in mind, we have made the decision to enforce SLT detentions on each Monday and Friday. SLT detentions will commence from the first week back and will run from 2:50pm to 4:50pm. This significant level of sanction will be enforced for students who do not attend a C4 detention. Parents will be informed if their child has a SLT detention via ClassCharts.

Reach Higher Programme
